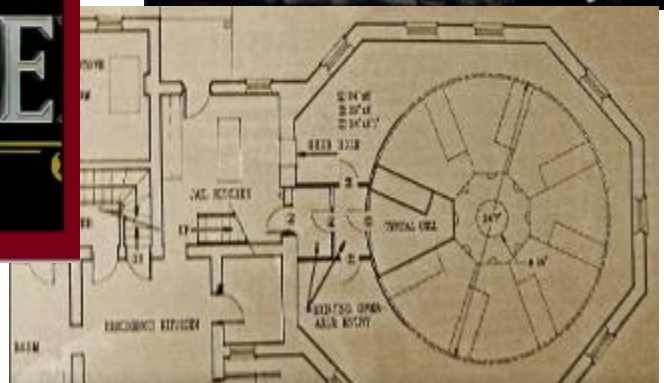
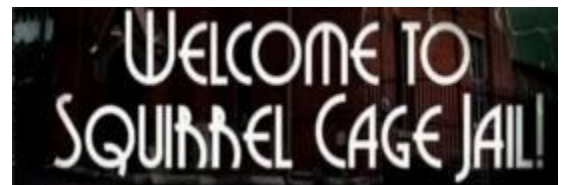

President's Corner: Reviewing '24, Looking to '25

2024 is just behind us, and our latest November-December issue highlighted virtually all of our accomplishments throughout last year. In addition to those, I would add the significant progress we have been making on Strategic Planning for PTWW and updating PTWW Bylaws.



And our Regional Chapter Video Meetings last November covered annual Chapter dues (*still remaining at \$2 per member after 15+ years without an increase*), Convention updates, planned encore Video Workshops, a new PTWW Listening Session (*for additional input from Chapters*), and a sampling of amazing accomplishments by participating Chapters.

Moving ahead in 2025, we will begin implementing some of our targeted Strategic Plan goals, which include the following projects and plans (*more will be included in our March-April edition*):

1) A major update of PTWW's Bylaws to respond to changes in our Chapters and their current and future membership, including new Chapter benefits, correcting ambiguous and duplicated sections, establishing accountability and clarifying expectations from both PTWW Board Members and Chapters,

conforming to and benefiting from recent legislative changes, protecting Chapters and PTWW from increasing external uncertainties and threats, and providing a stable foundation that allows for further US and international growth and development.

2) Increasing visibility and awareness of PTWW and all Chapters through collaborations and joint projects with other major nonprofits, developing new print and video marketing materials and platforms, encouraging Chapters to actively promote member readership of the *PrimeTimes* Newsletter to keep them informed and inspired, and collaborating with three local Chapters to increase visibility at the massive international World Pride event in D.C. this June.

3) Increasing our ongoing contacts and interactions with Chapters, providing access to technical support for Boards and Chapter members, supporting Chapters in need, and actively seeking Chapter feedback on proposed PTWW Bylaw updates.

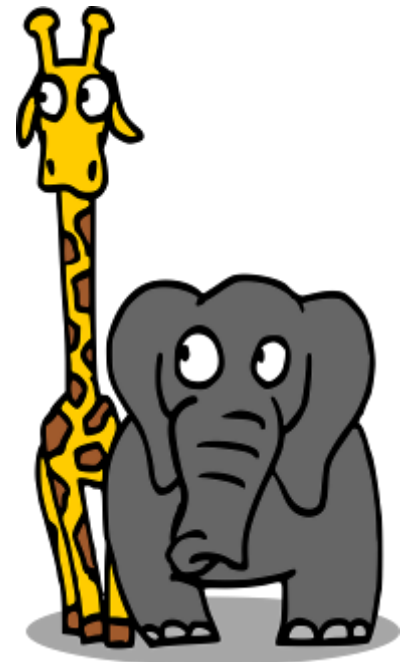
We are being watched

WHO ARE INDEPENDENT CHAPTER MEMBERS?

PTWW Independent Chapter
WhatsApp

PTWW’s Great Independent Members, **'I Guys'**, are PrimeTimers® who do not live near an existing chapter and are offered many of the same benefits enjoyed by Local Chapter Members. The nucleus of future chapters can be our "I Guys", as we encourage our independent members to consider starting a new chapter when a nucleus is found in a geographic area. A large percentage of the membership is outside of the United States and always provides an interesting video meeting.



I-Guys are connecting with “WhatsApp” and receive regular calendar updates about nearby activities. They are also visiting distant chapters and connecting with in person. Newly-printed membership cards help identify who they are. For example, one I-Guy came from Australia to Kansas City, with other members from the US visiting Barcelona and Spain!

In 2024 we have started monthly Zoom calls on the 2nd Saturday of each month and have completed 10 of these in 2024. We strive to have speakers and/or a member who is doing something unique within PrimeTimers.

The December 14 call focused on:

1. The 50th Anniversary of World Pride in Washington, DC and a possible I-Guys Gathering that weekend.
2. We have started planning our reunion at the Omaha Convention, set for Thursday, October 9.
3. The PTWW Strategic Planning Meeting preliminary reports were reviewed.



We reviewed the critical Independent components that have evolved over the Fall:
